BABAK ROSHANINEJAD

The political terms Left and Right were coined during the French Revolution of 1789 referring to the seating arrangement in the Estates General: those who sat on the left generally opposed the monarchy and supported the revolution, including the creation of a republic and secularization, while those on the right were supportive of the traditional institutions of the Old Regime. Ever since, the two standpoints have found various social and political instances. When a speculative perception downgrades to a political strategy, however, it loses its constructive spirit. This is when painting, one of the most symbolic means of representation, manages to cultivate social taste with its artistic, ironic and enigmatic approach by questioning social significances implicitly without suggesting any predefined and definite denotation.

Roshaninejad's work has been exposed in a number of national and international exhibitions and art fairs. As well as being part of several prominent private collections, his work is in the permanent collection of The Tehran Museum of Contemporary Art.

MOJTABA TAJIK

Being recognized mostly for his *Boxes*, Mojtaba Tajik's paintings of shoes go beyond the subject that he paints. In his hyper-realistic compositions, Tajik uses shoes to portray varied characteristics of individuals and their social and intimate relationship. Through his painterly technique and by creating the aptitude for a subjective decoding, he emphasizes the flamboyance of the shoes and the visual power of his compositions by magnifying what he intends to expose and draws the reality of shapes for the sake of their surrealistic nature.

Tajik has held several solo shows in Iran, the US and Qatar and participated in numerous national and international group exhibitions. A collection of his works was published in the book titled Boxes in 2007.

MOHAMMAD GHAZALI

Closed Doors, Sleeping Eyes is an ongoing project by Mohammad Ghazali that started in 2003. All photos were taken late at night from various shop windows, violating the privacy of objects after being exposed to public during the day, corresponding to similar social conditions. By minimizing each shot and placing it in a light box, the artist invites his audience to peek through the window, intrigues them to even try hear the illusionary sound of each photo and tempts them to make a story of their own by giving them a title for each picture. In 2004, Mohammad Ghazali's work, Self-portrait, won him the 1st place prize at the 9th International Photography Biennial of Tehran, giving him a 3-month research opportunity at the Cite International Des Arts in Paris. Ever since his first solo show in 2002, he has participated in several national and international exhibitions and his work has been exposed at Paris Photo, Contemporary Istanbul and Art Moscow.

REZA LAVASSANI

Known for his enigmatic papier-māché sculptures and paintings, Reza Lavassani displays his visualization of subjects inspired and taken from old stories, fables, symbols and poems rooted in Persian culture. He spent years studying philosophy and mysticism, constantly wondering about the basic meanings of mythology, sociology, religion and history all of which provided him with a new understanding of time and humanity. Lavassani's visual interpretations of his idiosyncratic reading of Persian literature and poetry are articulated in minimal yet detailed compositions depicting an ancient feel expressed in a progressive language.

Lavassani has been part of numerous national and international exhibitions and art fairs. He has been the recipient of several awards including UNESCO's Noma Concourse in 1994 and 2007 and the first prize of Tehran's 4th Biennial of Sculpture and 6th Biennial of Illustration. His work has also been included in a number of publications inside and outside Iran in addition to being part of many important collections.

SAMIRA ALIKHANZADEH



Focusing on concept of identity in relation to past and present, Samira Alikhanzadeh finds inspiration in the melancholic and humoristic quality of old images. In her renowned *Persian Carpet* series, she uses old photographs of women from the 1940's and 1950's who appeared uncovered in public for the first time and places them in the forefront of real carpets from the same period. By applying mirror fragments in her compositions, the experience of viewing the works take on a subjective manner as viewers see their own reflections in the paintings and their roles as objective observers turn into an experience shared with the subject.

Alikhanzadeh has taken part in over 30 exhibitions and art fairs all across the globe since 1995. In addition to her works being part of important private collections worldwide, the Los Angeles County Museum of Art (LACMA) acquired two works from her *Persian Carpet* series in 2010.
